

An Update on COVID-19 vaccinations in Chile

Santiago, March 1st, 2021. The Government of Chile maintains its goal to vaccinate the majority of the ~5 million people of the "at-risk groups" by the end of the first quarter of 2021, and the majority of the 15 million adult population during the first semester of 2021. As of the end of February, 3.4 million have received the first dose of a vaccine.

To this end, the Government of Chile has signed a contract with SINOVAC for the purchase of 4 million more doses, in addition to the 10 million SINOVAC doses that had been previously informed.

An updated list of Chile's COVID-19 vaccine agreements is described below:

- SINOVAC: 14 million doses (double dose)
- Pfizer-BioNTech: 10 million doses (double dose)
- COVAX Global Alliance: 7.6 million doses (double dose)
- AstraZeneca: up to 4 million doses (double dose)
- Johnson & Johnson: up to 4 million doses (mono dose)

Of the amounts described above, as of the end of February, 7,865,476 SINOVAC doses and 505,050 Pfizer-BioNTech doses had been received.

Looking ahead, a shipment of 2 million SINOVAC doses is scheduled for the first week of March. Separately, 818,400 doses of the AstraZeneca vaccine are set to be delivered starting in May, as part of the COVAX Global Alliance contract.

Finally, in order to ensure the vaccination targets are met, the Government continues to negotiate the purchase of additional COVID-19 vaccines, including from other laboratories that have had positive results.

Progress on Administered Doses


Regarding progress on administered doses, as of Sunday February 28th at 17hrs (SCL), 3,361,278 people had been vaccinated with the first dose, and 56,064 with the second dose.

The vaccination program has a daily calendar that is announced weekly. During the previous week, aged 65 and above, as well as healthcare workers, teachers, those who fulfill essential functions of direct attention to citizens were vaccinated as well as dialysed and organ




transplant patients. This week, vaccinations continued for people aged between 64-60 years, and Preschool and school education workers.
